The 2008 audit committee members, Charlie Bear, Sue Peterson and Bill Stembaugh, reported that they spent about one hour doing the audit and the financials balanced perfectly.

The 41st Street residents reported that people are driving "way too fast" since the street was paved.

New Business

The board positions of Charlie Bear, Shary Belfy, and Sue Petersen are open for election this year. Charlie Bear said he will continue in his position if elected. Shary Belfy and Sue Peterson declined to run again. Bill Stembaugh presented a proposed slate with Millie Pawlowski and Roland Harring to fill the vacant positions. The slate was accepted by a majority present. The board will make a decision on the positions.
