Another summer season comes to a close...

It has been an exciting summer at the lake. We have had great weather and lots of lake issues to talk about. The Eurasian Milfoil invasion which caused so much concern has been controlled for this season. We may see a resurgence of the weed next spring, and if we do Professional Lake Management will again treat the lake to keep it under control. Our lake regulations that have been confusing and to some people seem out dated are being reviewed by the DNR and the township. We should have a decision on this issue by the spring. And the study of our current form of sewage management resulted in an extensive investigation of possible alternatives to individual septic tanks. After the informational meetings were held and the survey results were tallied none of the lakes received the 51% vote needed to proceed with either a centralized sewer system or testing of the septic tanks surrounding the lakes.

The lake comes alive with fall color...

With fall in full swing and the winter approaching we say goodbye to some of our residents who either leave for warmer climates or close their summer homes till next year. Because many of our homes will be vacant for the next several months those of us that spend the winter here have to remember to keep an eye on our neighborhood. This summer has seen several incidents of property damage and theft and the winter months do not deter this type of activity. Lake properties can be more susceptible to break ins during the off season. There is a Neighborhood Watch group established in Paw Paw Township and the Three Mile Lake Corporation has begun sending a representative to their meetings. The corporation keeps contact information on all the lake property owners. If you see anything suspicious please contact the police and if you do not know how to reach your neighbor contact a board member, they will know how to reach the property owner.

Looking to next year...

The new year will be here before we know it. The board will be looking for a place to hold the spring membership meeting. The weather in May is still too unpredictable to hold a meeting out of doors. If any one has a room in their home, a basement (finished or unfinished), or a heated pole barn/garage that would hold about 30 people would you consider hosting a meeting?
