WHO NEEDS TO TAKE A BOATER SAFETY COURSE?

Michigan conservation officers and Michigan county sheriffs encourage all persons operating boats in Michigan to enroll in a boating safety course.

Personal Watercraft

Those less than 14 years of age may not legally operate a PWC.

Those 14 and 15 years of age may operate a PWC legally only if they have obtained a boating safety certificate and:

- He or she is accompanied on board by his or her parent or legal guardian or by a person at least 21 years of age who has been designated by the parent or legal guardian or:
- He or she is operating or riding the PWC at a distance of not more than 100 feet from his or her parent or legal guardian or from a person at least 21 years of age who has been designated by the parent or legal guardian.

Those at least 16 years of age and born after December 31, 1978, may operate a PWC legally **only if** they have obtained a boating safety certificate.

Those born on or before December 31, 1978, may operate a PWC legally without restrictions.

SPECIAL THREE MILE LAKE BOATING RULES

The following boating rules were taken from the Van Buren County Sheriff's Office website, www.vanburencountysheriff.com/marine-patrol.com.

RUSH LAKE AND THREE MILE LAKE - R281.780.1 - Water skiing hours.

1. On the waters of Rush lake and Three Mile lake, Van Buren county, state of Michigan, no operator of any motorboat shall have in tow, or shall otherwise assist in the propulsion of, a person on water skis, water sled, surfboard, or other similar contrivance during the period from 7:30 p.m. to 11:00 a.m. of the following day.

LITTLE THREE MILE LAKE AND PORTION OF THREE MILE LAKE - R281.780.2

High-speed boating and water skiing prohibited.

- 2. On the waters of Little Three Mile Lake and on that part of Three Mile Lake south of the south eighth line of section 21, T3S, R14W, Van Buren county, state of Michigan, no operator of any motorboat shall:
- (a) Operate such motorboat at high speed.
- (b) Have in tow, or shall otherwise assist in the propulsion of, a person on water skis, water sled, surfboard, or other similar contrivance.

NEW LAWS AFFECTING USERS OF MICHIGAN LAKES THIS YEAR

The Van Buren County Sheriff's Department has notified us of some law changes that will impact boaters this year. The most important one is that they lowered the blood alcohol level in which a person can operate at. It used to be .10% but it is now .08%.

We received the following correspondence from the Southern Lakes Manager of PLM Lake & Land Management Corp., who manages and treats Three Mile Lake:

"I had someone in the area grabbing water quality samples and had him hit up your lake. He observed a pile of blue aquarium gravel on the launch ramp. I don't know for sure if someone dumped an aquarium into the lake but it looks like a strong possibility. It could have been someone's pet bluegill or some tropical fish that would have died quickly. Most likely it will not cause any issues but I just wanted to make you guys aware of it in case something new pops up down the road. We will keep our eyes out when we are out there. I also let the DEQ know so that there is a record of it but I doubt they will look into it at all."

Three Mile Lake has always been known as one of the cleanest waters in this part of the state. Please help us maintain that reputation by refraining from dumping things into the water that are harmful to its ecosystem. Aquarium plants, ash from fire pits, sewage, herbicides, animal waste, household garbage and lawn fertilizers are just a few of the many things that can quickly and easily tip the natural balance of our lake that has been keeping it clean for so many years.

DEQ permitting restrictions, national holidays, and/or weather conditions may influence the timing of treatments throughout the 2015 season. PLM treats each lake according to a schedule or season plan, established with the cooperation of your lake association, lake board or residents on the lake. The treatment schedule is approximate. Please watch your shoreline for the posting of the 8.5x11 inch, yellow or green signs. The signs will indicate the date of the treatment, the products used, and any restrictions on the use of treated water for swimming, watering lawns, etc. The property owners in this area are planning to have the waters chemically treated to control lake weeds and/or algae. This notice is being circulated in accordance with Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) procedures. Below is a list of herbicides that may be applied to the lake and the associated use restrictions. On the day of treatment, signs will be posted along the shoreline within 100 feet of treatment areas that indicate what products were used and specific water use restrictions that apply:
